In no way does this mean that our part in the process is finished, the council are our representatives and many valid concerns were brought up in the public meetings held this past month. It is a crucial time now for the community to participate in the democratic process. Voice

your comments and concerns directly to the council when the resolution is put on the agenda, in writing or in person, the council needs community input on this very special issue. This part is perhaps the most important part in the process to date, it will take your stamina, endurance and patience. You may even question why you got involved and then you will remember: to Save Honolua. This is our opportunity as the community to be the conscience of the council and the company so don't hold anything back, let your voice be heard.

Porta-Potties in Honolua?

If at first you don't succeed, try, try again. Although previous efforts to install port-a-potties at Honolua Bay were denied by DLNR, Sam Lemmo (of DLNR) has expressed interest in readdressing this issue. Their main concern is they would like to see a long term management plan for the area (don't we all) but I think they have finally got the message that this is a real solution that can be implemented immediately to address health and safety issues in this highly trafficked area.
